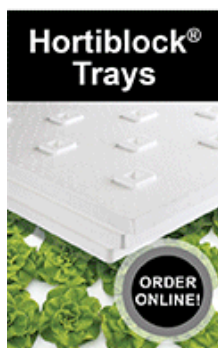

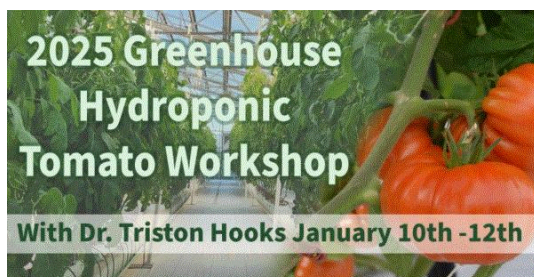

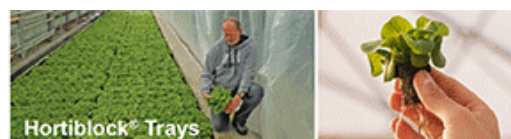
## UA-CEAC Greenhouse Hydroponic Tomato Intensive Workshop

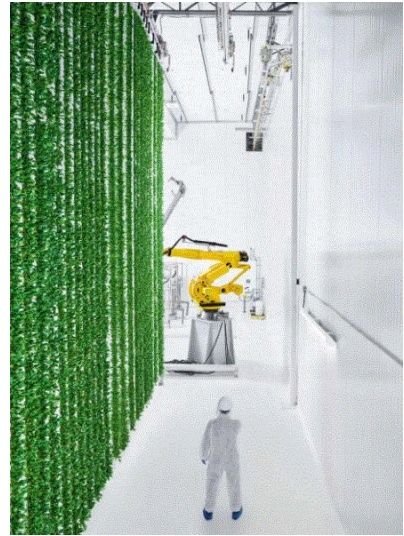


## Plenty Closes Compton Leafy Greens Farm

In a [LinkedIn posting](#) made last week, the indoor farming company [Plenty](#) has announced their plans to shut down their Compton-based leafy greens farm. On the heels of the company planting the first commercial batch of strawberries in their newly commissioned farm in Richmond, Virginia, Plenty cited “the rising cost of doing business in California, including climbing energy prices” as a chief influence in their decision.

As a former Plenty employee myself who worked heavily on both the Compton farm and the strawberry program, I must admit that this is a bittersweet moment, but I wish the company and my former coworkers the best as I anxiously await the first batch of Richmond berries to hit the market!
